



SULPHATE OF IRON

Sulphate of Iron is a plant food tonic for ericaceous (lime-hating) plants such as heathers, azaleas, rhododendrons and camellias. It can be used on any soil to correct iron deficiencies which cause leaf yellowing on roses and shrubs as well as ericaceous plants.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE

- Scatter 15 to 30 grams per square metre (0.4 to 0.9 oz per square yard) around the plants.
- Lightly fork or hoe in.
- Repeat once or twice through the growing season.

APPLICATION ADVICE

- Use the recommended amount.
- Apply evenly between the plants without touching the plant itself.
- Avoid using on windy days.
- Water well in after applying.
- Wash hands after use.
- Ferrous sulphate can cause stubborn stains, so avoid the product coming into contact with clothing or any surfaces other than the soil.
- Sweep up immediately if accidentally spilt.

STORAGE

- Store in a cool, dry place away from children, pets and foodstuffs.
